



Debbie submitted board minutes. Motion to approve (Lu/Paul) passed 3-1

John submitted both the July and August treasure report. Motion to approve (Scott/Lu) passed 4-0. There will be advertising billing going out for the current year and in December/January there will be a billing for the current 2003 season.

Charlene gave a membership report. The club has 255 members with 224 being voting members.
